Staff changes at the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh bring diverse experience and relevant skills to the work of building Jewish community.

Jason Oppenheimer — a new-hire who comes to Federation from Denver, Colo. — is Director, Young Adult Division. In his new position, Mr. Oppenheimer manages outreach to community members ages 22–45 and helps to develop the next generation of Jewish leaders. To this work he brings program- and leadership-development experience from prior positions at synagogues in New York, Massachusetts and Georgia. His resume also includes years as a senior staff member at Jewish camps. Mr. Oppenheimer is a Georgia native.

In addition, Ms. Slayton has served J'Burgh and BBYO in volunteer leadership positions. Ms. Slayton comes to the Federation from the Pittsburgh office of Eckert Seamans, where she served as Project Attorney.
