\*An approved Israel trip must be: 1) educational in nature 2) organized by an educational institution or religious institution 3) staffed by qualified personnel and 4) a minimum of three weeks, with the exception of approved trips from a Jewish day school. Birthright and family trips are not applicable.

\*\*Deposits of \$200 must be made for at least 4 years in order to be eligible for matching funds. Accounts may be created starting in first grade.
