THE FEDERATION'S ANNUAL CAMPAIGN AND JEWISH COMMUNITY FOUNDATION EMBODY THE VALUES AND TRADITIONS OF OUR JEWISH COMMUNITY. IT SAYS THAT WE - AS A COMMUNITY - ADDRESS CRITICAL NEEDS TODAY AND POSITION OURSELVES TO MEET CHANGING NEEDS IN THE FUTURE.

THE JEWISH FEDERATION'S PLANNING EFFORTS GAINED NATIONAL ATTENTION THIS YEAR WITH THE LODESTAR FOUNDATION COLLABORATION PRIZE AWARDED TO AGEWELL PITTSBURGH. THIS AND OTHER PLANNING SOLUTIONS CONTINUE TO UNCOVER WAYS TO LEVERAGE OUR COLLECTIVE POWER: UNITING HUMAN SERVICE AGENCIES THROUGH AGEWELL PITTSBURGH, WHICH HELPS AGING ADULTS STAY INDEPENDENT; REACHING OUT TO HELP THROUGH THE JEWISH FEDERATION VOLUNTEER CENTER, WHICH MOBILIZES THOUSANDS OF VOLUNTEERS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR; COLLABORATING THROUGH OUR COMMUNITY RELATIONS COUNCIL WITH OTHER RELIGIOUS AND ETHNIC COMMUNITIES AND WITH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO SUPPORT JEWISH CAUSES AND TO FIGHT ANTI-SEMITISM; AND THROUGH PARTNERSHIP2GETHER CONNECTING PITTSBURGHERS TO OUR SISTER REGION IN ISRAEL, KARMIEL-MISGAV, TO NURTURE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, HUMAN SERVICES AND JEWISH-ARAB COEXISTENCE.

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THANKS TO THE SUPPORT OF 3,865 DONORS AND A GENEROUS \$170,000

DOLLAR-FOR-DOLLAR MATCHING GRANT FROM THE GIANT EAGLE FOUNDATION, THE JEWISH FEDERATION OF GREATER PITTSBURGH RAISED \$13.7 MILLION FOR THE COMMUNITY CAMPAIGN (FORMERLY CALLED THE "ANNUAL CAMPAIGN").

PARTICIPATION IN THE STATE'S EDUCATIONAL IMPROVEMENT TAX CREDIT PROGRAM SECURED MORE THAN \$3.9 MILLION TO SUPPORT JEWISH DAY SCHOOLS AND PRESCHOOLS, AN INCREASE FROM THE PRIOR YEAR DUE IN PART TO INCREASED FUNDRAISING ACTIVITY. THE JEWISH HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION (JHF) CONTRIBUTED A \$900,000 BLOCK GRANT FOR SOCIAL SERVICES.

SIGNIFICANT NEW INITIATIVES WERE:

- COMMUNITY BUILDING COMPLETED WORK IN ADVANCE OF FIELDING THE JEWISH COMMUNITY STUDY, TO BE RELEASED IN 2018.

- FINANCIAL RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT ADDED SMALL ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS FOR BOTH WOMEN'S PHILANTHROPY (LADIES WHO LUNCH) AND MEN'S PHILANTHROPY (CONVERSATIONS THAT COUNT).

- SHALOM PITTSBURGH ADDED SOME YOUNG FAMILY PROGRAMMING INCLUDING THE GREAT AFIKOMEN HUNT FEATURING PASTA BEFORE PASSOVER IN COLLABORATION WITH PJ LIBRARY.

IN 2016-2017, THE YOUNG ADULT DIVISION (YAD) AND ITS OUTREACH AND ENGAGEMENT ARM, SHALOM PITTSBURGH, PROVIDED 28 SUCCESSFUL EVENTS WITH A TOTAL OF 538 UNIQUE INDIVIDUALS AND 2,128 ATTENDEES. THE YAD COMMUNITY CAMPAIGN EVENT AND ANNUAL HANUKKAH BOTH CHANGED TO REFLECT NEW

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PRIORITIES. SHALOM PITTSBURGH CONTINUED TO OFFER A WIDE RANGE OF PROGRAMS, INCLUDING SHABBAT DINNERS, WINE AND WISDOM, APPLES AND HONEY FALL FESTIVAL AND OTHER SOCIAL EVENTS.

THIS YEAR, ASSETS UNDER MANAGEMENT IN THE JEWISH COMMUNITY FOUNDATION REACHED MORE THAN \$243 MILLION. THIS INCREASE WAS DUE IN PART TO DONORS' ANTICIPATED CHANGES IN THE TAX LAWS AND STOCK MARKET INCREASES. THE FOUNDATION ADDED 72 NEW FUNDS, INCLUDING SIX NEW LION OF JUDAH ENDOWMENT FUNDS, BRINGING THE TOTAL NUMBER OF FUNDS TO 1,320. THE FOUNDATION ADDED \$20.2 MILLION IN NEW DOLLARS. THE FOUNDATION MADE GRANTS, FROM ITS UNRESTRICTED ENDOWMENT, TOTALING ALMOST \$853,000. TAKEN TOGETHER WITH DISTRIBUTIONS FROM RESTRICTED ENDOWMENTS, DONOR-ADVISED FUNDS, CAMPAIGN ENDOWMENTS, AND SYNAGOGUE AND AGENCY FUNDS, FOUNDATION DISTRIBUTIONS TOTALED \$17.7 MILLION, AN INCREASE OF \$0.9 MILLION OVER THE PRIOR YEAR.

THE JEWISH COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FUNDED ONE TABLE, A PROGRAM THAT EMPOWERS LOCAL PRE-FAMILY JEWISH YOUNG ADULTS IN THEIR 20S AND 30S WHO ARE UNCONNECTED TO JEWISH INSTITUTIONS TO CREATE THEIR OWN PERSONALIZED, HOME-BASED SHABBAT DINNER EXPERIENCES AND BUILD AN ENDURING FRIDAY NIGHT PRACTICE. THE FOUNDATION ALSO FUNDED THE GRINSPOON LIFE AND LEGACY (TM) PROGRAM THAT PROMOTES AFTER-LIFETIME GIVING TO BENEFIT LOCAL JEWISH INSTITUTIONS. THE FOUNDATION FUNDED COLLABORATION LIKE AGEWELL PITTSBURGH BETWEEN JEWISH DAY SCHOOLS AND A PROVIDER (JEWISH FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SERVICES) TO HAVE A FULL-TIME EMOTIONAL SUPPORT COUNSELOR ON STAFF.

IN ADDITION, THE FOUNDATION'S CENTENNIAL FUND FOR A JEWISH FUTURE, WITH

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\$24.3 MILLION IN TOTAL COMMITMENTS, FUNDED HONEYMOON ISRAEL, ENABLING COUPLES UNCONNECTED TO INSTITUTIONAL JEWISH LIFE, WITHIN THEIR FIRST FIVE YEARS OF MARRIAGE, TO ATTEND A TRIP TO ISRAEL TO ENCOURAGE REFLECTION AND DISCUSSION OF JEWISH IDENTITY. THE CENTENNIAL FUND ALSO FUNDED THE JCC HIDDUR INITIATIVE TO PROMOTE TRANSMISSION OF JEWISH VALUES; PHASE 2 FUNDING FOR DVASH, THE DYNAMIC VISION FOR THE ACTIVE STUDY OF HEBREW; ONWARD ISRAEL SUMMER INTERNSHIPS FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS WHO BUILD THEIR RESUMES AND THEIR CONNECTION TO JEWISH LIFE BY WORKING IN ISRAELI BUSINESSES AND ORGANIZATIONS; ONE HAPPY CAMPER, A PROGRAM THAT PROVIDES INCENTIVE GRANTS TO CHILDREN PARTICIPATING FOR THE FIRST TIME IN JEWISH OVERNIGHT CAMP; AND PJ LIBRARY, WHICH PROVIDES FREE JEWISH BOOKS TO PRESCHOOLERS.

THE FEDERATION HAS A 100-YEAR HISTORY OF INVESTING IN JEWISH COMMUNAL NEEDS ACROSS PITTSBURGH. BY PROVIDING ESSENTIAL OPERATING FUNDING, LEADING COMMUNITY-WIDE PLANNING EFFORTS, FOSTERING PARTNERSHIPS, AND SUPPORTING BEST BUSINESS PRACTICES, THE FEDERATION WORKS TO ENSURE THAT A NETWORK OF HIGH-QUALITY AGENCIES AND PROGRAMS ARE IN PLACE TO MEET THE CHALLENGING AND CHANGING NEEDS OF THE GREATER PITTSBURGH COMMUNITY. THROUGH ITS DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS, ENCOMPASSING THE ANNUAL CAMPAIGN, THE JEWISH COMMUNITY FOUNDATION AND VARIOUS OTHER MEANS OF RAISING FUNDS, THE FEDERATION SUPPORTS A VAST RANGE OF COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES.

THE FEDERATION'S COMMUNITY BUILDING AREA EXPANDED MANY PROGRAMS IN 2016-2017 AND PLANNED AREAS THAT WILL PRODUCE COMMUNITY-WIDE BENEFITS IN THE NEAR FUTURE. EFFORTS AROUND COMMUNITY NEEDS INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING:

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- PLANNING FOR "DEEP DIVE" STRATEGIC ANALYSES OF BENEFICIARY AGENCIES WITH THE GOAL OF IMPROVING LONG-TERM VIABILITY AND ENSURING GOVERNANCE BEST PRACTICES.

- FURTHER EXPANSION OF THE HOMEMEDS PROGRAM WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF AGING A COMPUTERIZED RISK-ASSESSMENT SCREENING TO HELP AVOID MEDICATION PROBLEMS; AND THE AGING MASTERY PROGRAM COMBINING EDUCATION WITH GOAL-SETTING, DAILY PRACTICES, AND PEER SUPPORT TO HELP PARTICIPANTS TO MAKE MEANINGFUL AND ENDURING CHANGES IN HEALTH, FINANCES AND LIFE ENRICHMENT.

- INCLUSION INITIATIVES, INCLUDING THE COMPLETION OF ROSH PINA, A YEAR-LONG FELLOWSHIP TO CREATE A STRATEGIC PLAN TO IDENTIFY DISABILITY INCLUSION OPPORTUNITIES IN JEWISH PITTSBURGH; THE COMPLETION OF DIGITIZING THE CONNECTIONS DISABILITY NEWSLETTER; AND CONTINUED FUNDING FOR THE REELABILITIES FILM FESTIVAL.

- BUILDING TEEN AND YOUNG ADULT JEWISH IDENTITY THROUGH EDUCATIONAL TRIPS TO ISRAEL WITH PEERS; THE DILLER TEEN FELLOWS, WHICH ENGAGES TEENS IN LEADERSHIP TRAINING AND ISRAEL; BIRTHRIGHT ISRAEL, WHICH INTRODUCES YOUNG ADULTS TO ISRAEL; AND ONWARD ISRAEL, WHICH PLACED A RECORD 34 YOUNG PEOPLE IN SUMMER INTERNSHIPS WITHIN ISRAELI BUSINESSES AND INSTITUTIONS.

- COMPLETING PLANNING FOR THE 2017 JEWISH COMMUNITY STUDY, THE FIRST COMPREHENSIVE STUDY IN 15 YEARS LOOKING AT DEMOGRAPHICS AND NEEDS IN PITTSBURGH.

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- TRANSITIONING THE SOUTH HILLS JEWISH PITTSBURGH INITIATIVE TO A
PERMANENT HOME AT THE JEWISH COMMUNITY CENTER OF GREATER PITTSBURGH.

PROVIDE BROADER EDUCATION ON ISRAEL; PRESENTED A RETROSPECTIVE THE 50TH
ANNIVERSARY OF ISRAEL'S SIX DAY WAR; PARTNERED WITH THE EDWARD AND ROSE
BERMAN HILLEL JEWISH UNIVERSITY CENTER TO CONTINUE ISRAEL CAMPUS
AMBASSADORS, A PROGRAM THAT DEVELOPED NINE STUDENT LEADERS TO SUPPORT A
PRO-ISRAEL CLIMATE ON PITTSBURGH COLLEGE CAMPUSES; AND CONVENED THE CRC
DELEGATE ASSEMBLY, COMPRISING REPRESENTATIVES FROM MORE THAN 50
ORGANIZATIONS THROUGHOUT SOUTHWEST PENNSYLVANIA, TO EDUCATE THE JEWISH
COMMUNITY ON AFRICAN AMERICAN-LAW ENFORCEMENT RELATIONS IN PITTSBURGH,
AND TO AGREE ON A POLICY IN SUPPORT OF EQUAL VOTING RIGHTS. THE CRC
ALSO CONTINUED THE PARTNERSHIP WITH VIBRANT PITTSBURGH, DISTRIBUTING
\$50,000 TO GRASSROOTS ORGANIZATIONS THAT STRENGTHEN THE REGION; HIRED
AN ASSISTANT DIRECTOR AND BROUGHT IN EXPERT TRAINING TO FIGHT BOYCOTT,
DIVESTMENT AND SANCTIONS AGAINST ISRAEL; ORGANIZED APPROXIMATELY 100
MEMBERS OF THE JEWISH COMMUNITY TO MARCH TOGETHER IN THE LGBT PRIDE
PARADE WITH THE SLOGAN "LOVE IS KOSHER." CRC CONTINUED OUR SUPPORT AND
PARTNERSHIP WITH THE BLACK POLITICAL EMPOWERMENT PROJECT'S CEIR
(CORPORATE EQUITY AND INCLUSION ROUNDTABLE), ABSORBED THE
CATHOLIC-JEWISH EDUCATION ENRICHMENT PROGRAM (C-JEEP) FROM THE
PITTSBURGH AREA JEWISH COMMITTEE AND ENGAGED APPROXIMATELY 1,750

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PITTSBURGH PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS THROUGH #BEOURVOTEPGH, A CIVIC ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM FOR PITTSBURGH PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AROUND THE 2016 ELECTION.

HOLOCAUST CENTER

THE HOLOCAUST CENTER OF PITTSBURGH EXPANDED USE OF THE NEW SPACE AND HOSTED NOTABLE PRIEST FATHER DESBOIS, WHO WORKED TO UNCOVER MASS GRAVES OF JEWS KILLED BY NAZIS IN THE FORMER SOVIET UNION. IN ADDITION, THE HOLOCAUST CENTER CONTINUED TO HOST A KRISTALLNACHT COMMEMORATION, FEATURING THE CLARION QUARTET OF THE PITTSBURGH SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA; HOSTED THE YOM HASHOAH COMMEMORATION; AND OPENED FOUR DIFFERENT ORIGINAL EXHIBITIONS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. THE HOLOCAUST CENTER COORDINATED WITH VARIOUS SCHOOLS, SOCIAL SERVICE AGENCIES, COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS, AND MAYOR BILL PEDUTO AND COUNCILMAN DAN GILMAN TO PAINT CERAMIC BUTTERFLIES, IN MEMORY OF THE 1.5 MILLION CHILDREN WHO PERISHED IN THE SHOAH.

VOLUNTEER CENTER

THE JEWISH FEDERATION VOLUNTEER CENTER VOLUNTEER CENTER ENGAGED ALMOST 2,750 VOLUNTEERS IN 2016-2017, INCLUDING SOME 1,100 WHO HAVE VOLUNTEERED REPEATEDLY THROUGH THE CENTER. THIS YEAR THE VOLUNTEER CENTER INCREASED THE NUMBER OF CUSTOMIZED VOLUNTEER PARTIES, WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO SUIT A GROUP'S SPECIFIC INTERESTS. VOOM! (VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY OF THE MONTH!) TOOK VOLUNTEERS TO SEVERAL NEW SITES THIS YEAR. I-VOLUNTEER, A PARTNERSHIP WITH FRIENDSHIP CIRCLE, ENGAGED CIRCLE ALUMNI IN MEANINGFUL SERVICE. THE EVER-POPULAR "MEGA EVENTS," MITZVAH

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DAY AND GOOD DEEDS DAY, ENGAGED MORE THAN 1,500 VOLUNTEERS. MITZVAH DAY DREW A RECORD 1,200 PARTICIPANTS TO 115 SITES. GOOD DEEDS DAY MORE THAN DOUBLED IN SIZE AND DREW MORE THAN 550 VOLUNTEERS TO 42 SITES.

PARTNERSHIP2GETHER

PARTNERSHIP2GETHER BROUGHT 3 DELEGATIONS TO PITTSBURGH THIS YEAR: THE HAZAMIR TEEN CHOIR, THE DILLER TEEN FELLOWS, AND THE WALDMAN INTERNATIONAL ARTS AND WRITING FIRST- AND SECOND-PLACE WINNERS. THEY WERE HOSTED BY 35 HOST FAMILIES. 250 PEOPLE ATTENDED THE HAZAMIR CONCERT AT RODEF SHALOM, AND THIS YEAR, PARTNERSHIP2GETHER ADDED A CONCERT IN THE SOUTH HILLS AT MT. LEBANON HIGH SCHOOL, WITH NEARLY 100 PEOPLE IN ATTENDANCE. THE WALDMAN INTERNATIONAL ARTS AND WRITING WINNERS ENGAGED WITH 600 TEENS FROM FOUR PITTSBURGH SCHOOLS. IN THE SUMMER OF 2016, 18 ISRAELI CAMPERS FROM KARMIEL/MISGAV SPENT THREE WEEKS AT EMMA KAUFMANN CAMP, BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH AMERICAN CAMPERS AND PROVIDING OUR EKC CAMPERS WITH DAY-TO-DAY INTERACTION WITH ISRAELI PEERS.
